She also presented widely to whole school teams wishing to develop an integrated Literacy Development Program in secondary schools.

After successfully holding numerous leadership positions in her schools, in 1998, she was appointed Assistant Principal of Shepparton High School. Her first principal's appointment was to Gilmore Girls' College (formerly Footscray Girls) in 2001. This was followed by her recruitment as Principal of Glen Eira College in Caulfield; a position she revelled in for seven years.

After retiring in 2014, she worked part-time as an educational consultant; leading school self-assessments, audits and reviews.

In November 2016, her extensive educational and leadership experience led to her appointment as Chairperson of the Victorian Institute of Teaching (VIT) Council, a position she holds to this day.
